For a person out of state service at the time of retirement, the years of service he has accrued at the time of retirement shall be used to determine the earliest age that he would normally become eligible for regular retirement.

Final Status: Passed – Act 99

Neutral HB 748 by Representative Pearson

Relative to LASERS, requires each employer to pay individualized normal cost payments and amortization payments depending on which plans within the system its employees fall into. Requires, for accounting purposes, that each plan shall be allocated system assets in proportion to the accrued liability of each plan existing on June 30, 2010. Beginning with FY 2010-2011 and thereafter, each plan shall be allocated investment gains and losses in proportion to its individual assets. **Final Status: Passed—Act 1026.**

Oppose HB 784 by Representative St. Germain Establishes the Fire Marshal's Retirement plan for certain personnel employed by the office of the fire marshal on or after January 1, 2011. Final Status: Failed

Oppose HB 930 by Representative Tucker Establishes a defined contribution plan for members of plans who are hired on or after January 1, 2011. Final Status: Failed

Oppose HB 931 by Representative Tucker Proposed constitutional amendment which permits the legislature to establish a defined contribution plan for members of state retirement systems hired on or after January 1, 2011. Final Status: Failed

Neutral HB 958 by Representative Ligi and Senator Appel

Relative to members of public retirement systems hired on or after July 1, 2010, increases the Final Average Compensation (FAC) period used to calculate benefits to the average of the highest 10 years of earnings. Provides for anti-spiking during those 10 years of employment, whereby the earnings during any year in such period shall not increase by more than 10%. **Final Status: Failed**

Oppose SB 14 by Senator Appel

Proposed law allows a reemployed LASERS retiree who previously named a prior spouse as beneficiary upon retiring initially to designate his current spouse as beneficiary for the purposes or any supplemental benefits that accrued after his reemployment, but only to the extent that such supplemental benefit did not accrue during his marriage to his previous spouse.

Final Status: Failed

Neutral SB 58 by Senator Butch Gautreaux

Provides that any member of LASERS who has credit in the system for at least five years of service and has attained the age at which the member would be eligible to retire but who lacks five years or less of service credit to become eligible to retire shall be eligible to purchase up to five years of service credit in one year increments for purposes of attaining eligibility for retirement and calculation of benefits. Provides that any member shall apply to the system for such credit on or before August 31, 2010 and pay to the system by December 31, 2010, the greater of the amount calculated in accordance with the actuarial cost provisions of present law or the employee and employer contributions plus interest based on the member's current salary, which totally offsets the increase in accrued liability of the system resulting form the receipt of credit by the members. The amount shall be paid in one lump sum and no service credit shall be given to the member until the amount is paid in full.

Final Status: Failed

Neutral SB 134 by Senator Butch Gautreaux

Relative to the Public Retirement Systems' Actuarial Committee (PRSAC). Moves PRSAC from Dept. of the Treasury to the legislature. Current law requires PRSAC to report findings and recommendations to the Joint Leg. Retirement Committee. Proposed law changes reporting to the House and Senate Retirement Committees and the Joint Legislative Budget Committee. Changes PRSAC mtgs from quarterly to as necessary. **Final Status: Passed---Act 874.**

Neutral SB 594 by Senators Butch Gautreaux and Appel

Relative to public retirement systems' investments and to provide relative to the prudentman rule, investment authority and restrictions and asset allocations. **Final Status: Passed---Act 1004.**

Oppose SB 602 by Senator Butch Gautreaux

Provides that no member who has less than ten years of creditable service on July 1, 2010 in LASERS, TRSL or LSERS shall be permitted to participate in DROP. Requires that any cost of proposed law be funded with additional employer contributions. **Final Status: Failed**

Support SB 632 by Senators Butch Gautreaux and Nevers and Representative Robideaux

W/Changes Relative to LASERS, LSERS, LSPRS and TRSL, regarding the provision of a regular schedule for permanent benefit increases for retirees. Proposed law, applicable to persons who are retired from these systems on June 30, 2010, generally provides for a 2% benefit increase for eligible retirees in every odd-numbered year beginning in 2017. Provides than an eligible retiree is one who: 1) has been separated from service and receiving a benefit for one year and 2) has attained the age of 62. Provides for additional employee contributions of 2% pay for each active member of these systems, beginning January 1, 2011. Provides generally that a person who retires from one of the systems on or after July 1, 2010, if he is otherwise eligible on the date the benefit increase is effective, shall receive a 2% benefit increase in every odd-numbered year beginning in 2021. Provides that an eligible retiree is one who: 1) has been separated from service and receiving a benefit for one year and 2) has attained the age of 65. **Final Status: Failed**

House Concurrent Study Request 8 by Representative Tucker

This instrument requests the House and Senate committees on retirement to jointly study issues related to board membership and system investments. **Final Status: Adopted**

Senate Concurrent Study Request 4 by Senator Butch Gautreaux and Representatives Pearson and Robideaux

This instrument requests the House and Senate Retirement Committees to jointly study the appropriate manner in which to provide for regular and dependable permanent benefit increases for retirees of the state retirement systems. **Final Status: Adopted**
