# AFFAIRS DIRECTOR'S MESSAGE

The 2021 Regular Louisiana Legislative Session is concluded! This year's Regular Session ended (sine die) at 6:00 p.m. on Thursday, June 10th. It is anticipated that a Special Legislative Session on

Congressional redistricting will be held before the end of the year or early next year.

The session was relatively uneventful for RSEA, with the exception of proposed Senate Bill 22 by Senator Barrow Peacock of Shreveport-Bossier. This measure proposed to raise the age for eligibility of regular retirement to the greater of 5 years of service at the age of 67 or the age of retirement set by the Social Security Administration; or 40 years of service at age 62. Fortunately, this bill did not pass, but it can be brought back again next year for reconsideration. RSEA opposed this measure!

Also, for the first time since 2016, a COLA bill (SB 24 by Senator Ed Price) was proposed and passed to become Act 37. It provides for a "minimum benefit increase" for certain retirees, beneficiaries and survivors of LASERS (State Employees),

TRSL (Teachers) and LSERS (School Employees) and a one-time 13th check for certain retirees of Louisiana State Police Retirement System (LSPRS). The bill only impacted about 1200 combined retirees in the above State Pension Systems, whose retirement benefits were below the federal poverty level. That is, they received less than \$1,450 per month in benefits, and had at least 30 years of service, and had been retired for at least 15 years, and did not participate in DROP/IBO.

With the conclusion of the 2021 Regular Session, you will find the 2021 "RSEA Legislative Report" (elsewhere in this newsletter), which details the bills RSEA was tracking during the session, along with RSEA's recommended positions and the bills' final outcomes.

Of special note is HCR-7 by Representative Michael "Mike" Johnson of Pineville, LA. This measure impacts all state and statewide retirement systems and memorializes (urges and requests) the United States Congress to take actions necessary to review and eliminate or reduce the Government Pension Offset (GPO) and the Windfall Elimination Provision (WEP) better known as the Social Security Offsets. The House Concurrent Resolution passed both chambers of the legislature with unanimous votes!

It is now up to the U.S. Congress to undertake legislation at the Federal level to repeal one or both of these dreadful federal offsets. This leads us to a discussion of legislation currently pending in the U.S. Congress (in Washington, D.C.) pertaining to the GPO and/or WEP.

I will first start with H.R. 82 by Congressman Rodney Davis (R-IL). This bill was first introduced on January 4, 2021 as The Social Security Fairness Act of 2021. If successfully passed and signed by the President, it would eliminate the GPO and WEP effective for Social Security benefits payable after December, 2021. It currently has 156 Cosponsors, 116 Democrats and 40 Republicans, including the entire Louisiana congressional delegation: Graves, Higgins, Johnson, Letlow, and Scalise; with the exception of recently-elected Troy Carter.

Another measure, S.1302 (Social Security Fairness Act) by Senator Sherrod Brown (D-OH) was recently introduced on April 22, 2021 and has 30 Cosponsors (24 Democrats, 4 Republicans and 2 Independents). Both of Louisiana's Senators, Cassidy and Kennedy are currently signed on as Cosponsors. This measure, like HR-82 above, would repeal the WEP and GPO for months beginning after December, 2021.

Finally, the only other pending Federal legislation I am aware of regarding the Social Security Offset(s) is H.R. 2337 by Congressman Richard Neal (D-MA), Chairman of The House Committee on Ways and Means. The bill was introduced on April 1, 2021 as the Public Servants Protection and Fairness Act of 2021 and it

has 160 Cosponsors, all Democrats. No Louisiana Congressional Representatives have signed on as Cosponsors to this measure as of this writing!

H.R. 2337 by Rep. Richard Neal-MA – this legislation was recently introduced and calls for a partial repeal of the Windfall Elimination Provision (WEP) only. Current beneficiaries (and those turning 62 before 2023) who are affected by the WEP due to their own public service work would receive an extra \$150 a month, starting nine months after enactment and continuing for as long as the eligible individuals are receiving Social Security benefits. The relief amount cannot exceed the size of each person's current WEP reduction. Future retirees (those turning 62 in 2023 and later) would be eligible for a new benefit formula, called the Public Servant Protection (PSP) formula. Several members of the WEP National Coalition have expressed this legislation has a higher chance of moving through Congress. Currently, none of Louisiana's U.S. Representatives have cosponsored H.R. 2337.

RSEA is supporting all three of the above "Social Security" measures. While H.R. 82 and S.1302, which repeal both the WEP and GPO, are our preferred bills, the likelihood of passage is not as likely as H.R. 2337. Therefore, we are also supporting H.R. 2337, as we feel the chances of passage are more likely due to the reduced cost to the Social Security Trust Fund than the other two measures. In addition, we feel that this bill (H.R. 2337), if approved, will at least show some progress toward reducing these inequities, and will set the stage for future reductions of the WEP penalties, as well as those penalties associated with the GPO.

Of particular note concerning H.R. 2337, "Public Servants Protection and Fairness Act of 2021" by Chairman Richard Neal (D- MA), mentioned above, please contact your Louisiana/U.S. Congressional Representative and ask them to co-sponsor this legislation, as no Louisiana Representatives have signed on to this measure as of yet. Also, contact your friends and relatives in other states, and ask them to contact their U.S. Senators and U.S. Representatives in their states, and request they too co-sponsor the above proposed federal legislation.

### 2021 Legislation Impacting RSEA with Recommended Positions:

### **HB 19 - Mack**

**Systems Impacted: LASERS** 

Provides relative to the selection of certain optional survivor benefits for a member of the Louisiana State Employees Retirement System (LASERS), who has a mentally disabled child. Provides procedures for and limitations on such an election.

RSEA: Neutral | Outcome: Passed

### HB 89-Bagley

**Systems Impacted:** Individual Income Tax Deductions

Establishes an individual state income tax deduction and adds to the list of income not included in "tax table Income" the costs of premiums an owner or operator of a personal automobile pays to secure a motor vehicle liability insurance policy up to a \$1500 maximum premium effective January 1, 2022.

RSEA: No Position | Outcome: Failed

### SB 3- Milligan

**Systems Impacted:** Office of Group Benefits

Requires certain employing agencies to provide health insurance coverage from date of hire under certain circumstances, if the employee is assigned duties in declared disaster area performing risky activities integral to the duties of the employee & that involve risks to health or well-being of the individual.

RSEA: No Position | Outcome: Failed

### SB 11-Talbot

**Systems Impacted:** Individual Income Tax Exemptions

Provides for individual and corporate income tax exemption for state and federal COVID-19 relief benefits. Proposed law excludes unemployment compensation benefits to a taxpayer from the individual income tax exemption above \$10,200 Adjusted Gross Income (AGI) for the tax year 2020.

RSEA: No Position | Outcome: Passed (Act 54)

### SB 22-Peacock

**Systems Impacted:** LASERS, TRSL and LSERS

Changes retirement eligibility for new hires on or after July

1, 2021 (excluding Hazardous Duty Plan) to: 5 years of service at the greater of age 67 or the age of retirement set by the Social Security Administration; 40 years of service at age 62; or 20 years of service at any age (with actuarial reduction). And also changes disability retirement reporting requirements. For more info see accompanying newsletter article.

RSEA: Oppose | Outcome: Failed

### SB 190-Gary Smith

**Systems Impacted:** LASERS, TRSL and LSERS

Transfers the operation and maintenance of the weights and standards police officers from the Department of Public Safety and Corrections (DPS&C) to the Department of Transportation and Development (DOTD).

RSEA: Neutral | Outcome: Passed

### HB 516-Zeringue

**Systems Impacted:** LASERS and Teachers (TRSL)

Supplemental Appropriations from the FY 2019-2020 surplus certified by the JLCB at the 1/22/2021 meeting for payment to the balance of the UAL existing on June 30, 1988 in proportion to the balance of the UAL 6/30/20.

RSEA: Support | Outcome: Passed

### SB 24-Price

**Systems Impacted:** All four (4) State Retirement Systems

Provides a minimum retirement benefit increase for certain retirees, beneficiaries & survivors of LASERS, Teachers Retirement System (TRSL), School Employees Retirement System (LSERS) & State Police Retirement System. For more information see accompanying newsletter article.

RSEA: Support | Outcome: Passed

### **HCR 7- Mike Johnson**

**Systems Impacted:** All State and Statewide Retirement Systems

Memorializes Congress to take actions necessary to review and eliminate or reduce the Government Pension Offset (GPO) and the Windfall Elimination Provision (WEP).

RSEA: Support | Outcome: Passed

# NOMINATIONS CLOSE JULY 13 IN LASERS BOARD ELECTION

Nominations will be accepted by LASERS in the 2021 Board of Trustees Election until July 13, 2021, 4:30 p.m. Central Time. Every two years, LASERS members cast their ballots for candidates for the thirteen-member Board of Trustees. In this election, three seats will be filled by active members and one by a retired member. Voting will occur in September and October and results certified and published by the Board in November.
